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Dear Doctors,

We are glad to invite you to a CME programme organized by Institute of Human Reproduction (IHR) on Sunday, 15th July 2007 at IHR auditorium on **CHICKENPOX IN PREGNANCY.**

As we all understand that Chickenpox (or primary VZV infection) is a common childhood disease when it usually causes a mild infection. As a result of childhood contact over 90% of the antenatal population are seropositive for VZV immunoglobulin G (IgG) antibody. For this reason, although contact with chickenpox is common in pregnancy, primary VZV infection is uncommon, i.e. it is estimated to complicate three in every 1000 pregnancies. Being such rare event, i.e. primary VZV infection in pregnancy, we thought it is important we brush our memories with its implications. To update with recent advances and to have a revision with basics in the subject this CME is being organised.
